Deadline for abstract submission up to 3 pages, including examples, is **June 30, 2011.** All abstracts should contain the following information:

- (1) title of the paper;
- (2) author's name;
- (3) author's affiliation;
- (4) author's e-mail address;
- (5) 5 key words;
- (6) abstract of the paper;
- (7) bibliography

Abstracts are invited for 25-minute slots (20-minute presentation plus 5 minutes for discussion).

The papers should be written either in Russian or English.
