Call for Papers

Third East Asian Conference of Slavic-Eurasian Studies 2011

The Chinese Association for Russian, East European and Central Asian Studies (CAREECAS), the Japanese Council for Russian and East European Studies (JCREEC), and the Korean Association of Slavic Studies (KASS) hereby announce that the Third East Asian Conference of Slavic-Eurasian Studies on <u>Russia and Eurasia in Post-Financial</u> <u>Crisis Era</u> will be held in Beijing, China, <u>on August 27 and 28, 2011</u>. CAREECAS serves the host organization this year. The <u>location</u> of this conference is Institute of Russian, East European and Central Asian Studies of Chinese Academy of Social Sciences (Beijing, China). Our conference has been recognized as a regional conference of the International Council for Central and East European Studies (ICCEES).

You are invited to attend the Conference. The Organizing Committee will send all scholars included in the program an official letter of invitation for visa procedure. CAEERCAS requires that members of above mentioned associations and other interested scholars submit proposals for panels and papers. Note that <u>the deadline for proposals for panels</u> and papers is 18 June 2011. Scholars from other parts of Asia, Europe and North America are welcome. The size of this year's conference amounts to 120 participants, including 20 scholars for Japanese side, 20 scholars for Korean side and 20 scholars for other countries.

Guidelines for Proposals

I General Principle

- All proposals of panels/papers have to be scholarly in nature, and have to be approved by the Organizing Committee of the 2011 Convention, consisted of the three participating Associations, i.e. the CAEERCAS, the JCREEC, and the KASS. Approved proposals will only be included in the program of the 2011 Convention.
- 2. The official languages of the 2011 Convention are English and Russian. Interpreting service will not be available except for the open and closing ceremonies. Panel proposals and papers should be written in one of these languages.
- **3.** However, the language of the administration is English. All the correspondence, proposals, and abstracts have to be in English.
- **4.** Panels/papers will be categorized into four, i.e. Political Science (inclusive of Domestic and International politics), History, Economics and Culture & Linguistics.
- **5.** The allocated time for a panel will normally be 2 hours in maximum, and 20 minutes for a presentation of paper.
- **6.** Paper-givers are expected to submit their full paper including abstracts in due course.

II Proposals for Panels

- **1.** Should identify the category of the panel, e.g. Political Science (inclusive of Domestic and International politics), History, Economics and Culture & Linguistics.
- **2.** Should normally be consisted of a chair-person, up to four paper-givers, and at least two discussants.
- **3.** Should be represented by one of panelist as an organizer of the panel who is expected to conduct all the necessary communications between the panelists and the Organizing Committee of the 2011 Convention, except personalized needs of participants such as hotel reservation etc.
- **4.** Must be international in their composition. Panels comprised of participants from a single country will not normally be accepted.

- **5.** Should include the title of the panel; name, rank/position, and academic affiliation of the panelists (i.e. a chairperson, paper-givers, a discussant), the titles of papers though provisional they may be at this stage of proposal, and contact details of all the panel participants (postal addresses of affiliated institutions including zip code, phone & fax numbers in full with national code, local code, and extension if any, and email addresses).
- 6. Should include 300-400 word abstracts of the panel, and papers respectively.
- **7.** Have to be submitted only after the panel organizer's obtaining the consent of all the panel participants.

III Proposals for Individual Papers

- **1.** Should identify the category of the panel, e.g. Political Science (inclusive of Domestic and International politics), History, Economics and Culture & Linguistics.
- 2. Should include the title of the panel; name, rank/position, and academic affiliation, the titles of presentations though provisional they may be at this stage of proposal, and contact details (postal address of affiliated institution including zip code, phone & Fax numbers in full with national code, local code, and extension if any, and email address).
- **3.** Should include a 300-400 word abstract of the paper.

IV Procedures for Proposals

- Proposals have to be submitted electronically, and should be directed to <u>caeercas2011@gmail.com</u>. Only electronically submitted proposals will be accepted.
- **2.** <u>The deadline for proposals for panels and papers is 18 June 2011</u>. The Organizing Committee will finalize the program as early as possible.</u>
- 3. All proposals have to be in English.
