


Sugihara Chiune and the Soviet Union: New Documents, New Perspectives **A book talk with David Wolff, coeditor, moderated by Valentina Izmirlieva**





September 14 12pm Hybrid Event 1219 IAB In 1940 with Europe already at war, Japanese diplomat-spy Sugihara Chiune (often called the "Japanese Schindler") ignored direct orders from Foreign Minister Matsuoka and issued over 2000 Japanese transit visas to Jews stranded in Lithuania after the invasion of Poland. But these visas would have been worthless without Soviet transit visas to cross from Kaunas/Kovno to Vladivostok. Documents from Soviet and Japanese archives collected, edited and published by Japan's Slavic-Eurasian Research Center and the Holocaust Research Center in Moscow provide answers to many questions.
